# Fresh from the Hive

Three hotels reaping the benefits of on-site apiaries: thriving gardens and a sweet bounty of honey for guests.



TORTUGA BAY HOTEL, PUNTA CANA, DOMINICAN REPUBLIC

## The Buzz:

This collection of 13 villas is part of the Puntacana Resort & Club, whose apiary houses more than 200 bee colonies. The resort's Ecological Foundation sell's the Puntacana Forest Honey around the island.

#### Try It:

In dishes and cocktails at the resort's 15 restaurants and bars, or during the **Natural Thai Facial** at the Six Senses Spa. Villas from \$620, including breakfast daily, a 30-minute massage, and Dominican sweets.



CHEWTON GLEN HAMPSHIRE, ENGLAND

## The Buzz:

The 70-room manor house on England's southern coast shares its 130 acres with orchards, 12 treehouse suites, and **60 hives** looked after by a local beekeeper.

#### Try It:

In Chewton's signature honey parfait dessert, the spa's seasonal lavender and lemon drink, and for sale beside house-made jams and chutneys in the boutique. Doubles from \$499, including breakfast daily and a \$100 hotel credit.



THE FAIRMONT WATERFRONT, VANCOUVER, CANADA

## The Buzz:

On the 489-room hotel's thirdfloor terrace, hives shelter 200,000-plus honeybees in a garden with views of the city's mountain-backed harbor. A guide leads daily apiary tours between May and September.

#### Try It:

In the locally brewed Fairmont "Stinger" honey lager or hand-churned burnt-honey ice cream at ARC Restaurant. Doubles from \$279, including a chef's welcome gift, breakfast daily, and a \$55 hotel credit.
